## Meeting the board: James T. Dresher Jr.

Few people buy a horse farm before owning horses. But that's how current MHBA board member James T. (Jim) Dresher Jr., his late father, and his brother-in-law, Tony Meoli, went about it back in 1975.

It all started when Dresher Sr., a career corporate executive working in the oil business in Texas at the time, happened to see a *New York Times* article mentioning that former New York Yankees owner Larry MacPhail had his farm in Maryland up for sale.

Dresher Sr., having previously lived in this state, knew of MacPhail's once-majestic Glenangus Farm in Bel Air.

And Dresher Jr. was familiar with it, because he had made his home in Bel Air since graduating from Rutgers University as an economics major in 1972.

Glenangus had shrunk to 370 acres, with much of its land sold off for development, when the Dreshers took title to the property. Still, there was plenty of room for Jim Dresher to develop his newfound passion for Thoroughbred breeding and racing.

"I immediately fell in love with the horse world," he says.

At that time, Dresher and Meoli, himself a horse breeder, made a livelihood with McDonalds franchises.



Dresher plunged headlong into horse ownership at Glenangus, standing three stallions—Son Excellence, Disc and Cool Spring Park.

Glenangus's revival as a horse operation lasted for 15 years, until Dresher and Meoli decided to sell their McDonalds operations in 1990 and pursue other business opportunities. Needing to "muster all available capital," Dresher took a seven-year sabbatical from horses.

Finally, he could stay away no longer, and at the 1998 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic February mixed sale, Dresher paid \$15,500 for the maiden Smarten mare Smart Tally. From a mating with Citidancer the following year, Smart Tally produced the winner of the 2004 Maryland Million Distaff Handicap, Merryland Missy.

Although Dresher had sold Merryland Missy for \$23,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Eastern Fall Yearling sale, he experienced his greatest racing thrill to date as a participant in the Country Life Farm partnership that sent her out to victory on Maryland Million Day.

Now the CEO, as well as the founder and principal owner of Skye Hospitality LLC, which owns 10 hotels under the Hilton and Marriott brands in the Baltimore area, Dresher is reveling, once again, in life as a Thoroughbred breeder and owner.

He owns 16 horses, eight solely and eight in partnership with others, primarily Tom and Chris Bowman and Milton Higgins. Within his horse roster are those by Not For Love, Henny Hughes and Malibu Moon.

His racing operation, known as Huckleberry Farm LLC, has five horses divided among trainers Tim Ritchey, Dickie Small and Chuck Lawrence. Bill Reightler serves as his consultant and sales agent.

Glenangus no longer functions as a horse farm, but Dresher's mother, Virginia, continues to live there. Dresher and his wife, Patti, live two miles away at 25-acre Oakfield Farm, with daughter Megan (17) and son John (16). Dresher

has two grown children from a previous marriage; another son, James III, died several years ago at age 24.

Dresher keeps horses at his home farm, and at a 125-acre

farm that he owns on Harmony Church Road in Darlington.

Elected to the MHBA board for the first time in 2008, Dresher, who serves on a

number of civic boards in the Baltimore area, counts among his missions spreading the word about horse racing.

"We have one of the most exciting and fun sports in the

world," he says. "As an industry, we could be doing a whole lot more to bring other people in."

**W**illiam M. Backer's homebred Blind Date built on her near-flawless resume with a commanding four and a half-length victory in the off-turf Pearl Necklace Stakes

for Maryland-bred 3-year-old fillies on August 22 at Laurel Park.

It was the fourth stakes win in five outings this season for the Not For Love filly, who captured the Grade 3 Virginia Oaks in her previous start, on the grass on July 18 at Colonial Downs.

The 2-5 favorite and 122-pound heavyweight in the Pearl Necklace, carrying six pounds more than each of her rivals, Blind Date stalked the pace under Rosemary Homeister and drew off in the final sixteenth, leaving in her wake Five Diamonds, Ravenous, Hogan Beach and Southern Charmer. She completed the mile over a good track in 1:37.57.

Trained throughout her career by Hamilton Smith, Blind Date won her 2-year-old debut in stellar fashion in September

at Laurel Park, then turned in a subpar performance when third as the 1.9-1 favorite in the Maryland Million Lassie in October. The explanation came immediately after the race, when she was found to have a fever.

That was one of only two disappointments in her career, which includes victories over turf and dirt, at distances from five furlongs to a mile and an eighth, and varying track conditions.

In the Virginia Oaks, Blind Date registered a hard-fought victory over Shared Account, who went on to win the Grade 2 Lake Placid Stakes at Saratoga in August.

She began the season with back-to-back victories in the Hookedontheheelin (April 18) and Hilltop Stakes (May 15), both on the grass at Pimlico, turned in her lone off-the-board finish in Monmouth Park's Boiling Springs Stakes-G3 in June, then made amends by becoming a graded winner at Colonial Downs.

Blind Date has earned \$225,060 with a total of six wins from eight starts.

Blind Date is the third stakes performer Backer has bred from his good race mare Snit, a 1994 daughter of Fit to Fight who won or placed in eight stakes, including a victory in the 1997 Cotillion Handicap-G2, and earned \$454,547.

Blind Date is a third-generation homebred stakes winner for Backer, a retired advertising executive who raises his young stock at his Smitten Farm in The Plains, Va., but has foaled many of his best runners in Maryland.

Backer purchased Blind Date's great-granddam, Queen Ribot (by \*Sir Ribot), as a yearling for \$9,500 at a 1972 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky sale. A stakes winner and graded-placed earner of \$129,557,

Queen Ribot produced as her first foal Princess Roberta (1978, Roberto), who won or placed in 11 stakes, including a second in the Violet Handicap-G3, earning \$145,912.

Blind Date's year-older half-sister, Sales Tax (by High Yield), has won or placed in six stakes, earning \$143,756.

Snit remains in production at Smitten Farm, where her 5-year-old daughter, Bitter Lemon (by Lemon Drop Kid), is also a member of the broodmare band. Twice stakes-placed and an earner of \$140,421, Bitter Lemon has been pronounced in foal to Bluegrass Cat for 2010.

Snit has three offspring waiting to make their mark on the track: 2-year-old Grand Slam filly Count to Eleven, a yearling colt by Mineshaft, and a Malibu Moon colt born this year. She is in foal for 2010 to Smart Strike.

**M**aking his first start at his home track since September 27, 2007, Heros Reward found an easy assignment in the Maryland-bred restricted Mister Diz Stakes on August 15 at Laurel Park.

The 2007 Maryland-bred Horse of the Year and winner of numerous Maryland-bred divisional titles, Heros Reward had become a millionaire in his previous start, a second-place finish (to Silver Timber) in the Jaipur Stakes-G3 on July 18 at Belmont Park.

At age 7, he continues to rank among the best turf sprinters in the land, having won or placed in four of five outings this season, including a victory in his 2009 debut, the Grade 3 Shakertown Stakes in April at Keeneland, for owners Rob Ry Farm (Bob Haynes) and Jayne Marie Slys and Laurel-based trainer Dale Capuano.

Dispatched as the 1-5 favorite in the Mister Diz as part of an entry with stablemate Love You Too, Heros Reward raced wide and was unhurried before launching a six-wide bid under jockey Anna Napravnik to reach command and win by one and a quarter lengths in 1:02.62 for the five and a half furlongs on the firm turf.

"There was an honest pace so we just sat behind and waited to go," said Napravnik, who was riding Heros Reward for the first time. "He is an awesome horse."

Sharing high weight of 124 pounds with another star, King Leatherbury's Ah Day, Heros Reward gave six

pounds to each of his other rivals.

Rallying for second was Natural Seven, who outfinished third-place finisher Sandbagin' Lover by a head. The remaining order of finish consisted of Lycurgus, Ah Day, Disco Dandy, A Reel Buster and Love You Too.

Heros Reward (by Partner's Hero), now the 14th all-time leading Maryland-bred money-earner with \$1,045,298, was bred by longtime Howard County horsewoman Gretchen Mobberley.

He made five starts for the breeder before Haynes and Capuano claimed him for \$20,000 in April 2006 at Laurel Park. Mobberley recently lost Heros Reward's dam, the Caveat mare Lifes Passage, who was euthanized this past spring at age 17 after developing colic-type symptoms following the birth of a Langfuhr colt. But Mobberley and her daughter, Bird, are likely to receive future rewards with the weanling, as well as their 2-year-old Dance With Ravens colt out of Lifes Passage, named Crow Bar.

Heros Reward was expected to contest the Maryland Million Turf Sprint on September 26, then move on to the Grade 2 Nearctic Stakes at Woodbine on October 17, a Breeders' Cup Challenge "Win and You're In" race he captured two years ago. After that, the goal is a return trip to Santa Anita Park for the \$1 million Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint. He finished fifth in that race in 2008, beaten just two and quarter lengths.

**C**ynthia and Charles McGinnes have experienced many highs and lows during their 40-plus years of breeding and owning race horses. But nothing has affected them quite as deeply as the events of June 20, 2009.

That afternoon, the McGinneses' homebred 3-year-old Not For Love gelding Target Sighted broke his maiden over a sloppy track at Penn National.

The celebration was muted, to say the least, because only 40 minutes earlier Target Sighted's multiple stakes-winning half-sister All Smiles had broken down during the running of the Grade 3 Obeah Stakes at Delaware Park.

"Her injury was similar to Barbaro's," said Cynthia McGinnes, referring to the ill-fated winner of the 2006 Kentucky Derby.

The Obeah had been planned all along as the final start for All Smiles, a 6-year-old daughter of Awesome Again who carried the McGin-

neses' colors to victory in two stakes and placed in three additional added-money events, including the Grade 2 Allaire duPont Distaff Stakes.

After her injury, the McGinneses retained hopes of bringing All Smiles home to their Thornmar Farm in Chestertown, Md., where she would have the opportunity to flourish as a broodmare.

But that plan went horribly awry, and despite the best of medical care, including surgery performed by Dr. Dean Richardson at the University of Pennsylvania's New Bolton Center, All Smiles developed complications that could not be overcome. She was euthanized 21 days after the race.

So it was with mixed emotions, once again, that the McGinneses wheeled Target Sighted right back to win the Humphrey S. Finney Stakes for Maryland-breds on August 1 at Laurel Park.

The gelding campaigns in the name of The Maltese Cross II, a partnership of the McGinneses, longtime horseman Philip Torsney of Red Bank, N.J., and Francis Clemens, a retired Baltimore City Fire Department battalion chief. A fireman's badge is in the shape of a Maltese Cross.

Unraced at 2, Target Sighted has risen rapidly to the forefront of his state-bred division in just three career starts for trainer Frannie Campitelli (who also trained All Smiles).

The Finney was his first start on turf. Overlooked by the betting public, which sent



him off at next-longest odds of 11-1 in the field of five, Target Sighted was rated early by jockey Jonathan Joyce in the mile and a sixteenth contest, then rallied in midstretch and wore down Music City to score by a neck. Ham and Ernie was two and a quarter lengths back in third, followed by Friskie J and Belmont Park

shipper Winthrop House, the 1-5 favorite. Final time was 1:45.28 over good turf.

Target Sighted is the third stakes winner from his stakes-winning dam, Cranberry Muffin (by Shelter Half), who represents a highly successful family developed at Thornmar. Her other stakes winner is Two Punch Gal, a

2001 daughter of Two Punch who sold for \$225,000 at the Keeneland September Yearling sale and counted the Politely Stakes among her four victories; she earned \$141,583 during her career.

Cranberry Muffin's dam, Muffies Muffin (by Lord Gaylord), produced additional stakes winners Wicapi

(\$671,616), All the Marbles (\$255,807) and Col. Ralph (\$143,638), as well as stakes-placed Lady of Summer. She is also the granddam of stakes winners Water Cannon, Come Fly Away and Jet Run.

## Maryland-breds at Saratoga select sale

Three Maryland-bred yearlings sold for six figures at the Saratoga Selected Yearlings sale held August 10 and 11 in Saratoga Springs, N.Y. Each yearling represents a second-generation from two long-established Maryland farms.

Moon On Fire, a dark bay colt by former Maryland sire Malibu Moon, was purchased by Whitehorse Stable out of the Eaton Sales consignment for \$250,000 late on the second day. Hip number 230 (from 235 catalogued) was pro-

duced by Frank and Virginia Wright's 9-year-old unraced Polish Numbers mare Rich Legacy.

The colt's second dam is the unraced Nijinsky II mare Richly Rewarded, whom the Wrights purchased privately. The first foal out of the mare was the Wrights' stakes winner and accomplished producer Blue Sky Princess, the dam of graded winner Tessa Blue (\$533,100) and \$350,936-earner Inner Harbour, now a sire in West Virginia. Richly Rewarded also produced Maryland

Million Ladies Stakes winner Vaguely Rich.

The Wrights, who until recently owned Huntingfields Farm in Hampstead, sold the colt at Keeneland's January sale for \$90,000.

Two yearlings were sold as the property of their breeders, Mr. and Mrs. Charles McGinnes, in the name of their Thornmar farm, with Marshall Silverman as agent.

Frederic Sauque purchased Thornmar's bay filly by Street Cry (Ire) out of stakes winner and multiple stakes producer Foolish Kisses (by Cannonade) for \$150,000. The filly, named Theresmusicplaying, is a half-sister to four stakes winners, including graded stakes-winning sprinter Gotaghostofachance (\$405,240, Sport

Page H-G3, etc.) and New Jersey-bred champion mare Y'mtoogoodtogetrue.

Frankie Brothers was agent for Jack and Laurie Wolf and Donald and Barbara Lucarelli's Starlight Stable, who purchased Thornmar's Not For Love filly out of Crying in the Rain, named Just Say Goodbye, for \$120,000. Crying in the Rain is also the dam of stakes winners Water Cannon and Jet Run. Second dam, stakes-winning Muffies Muffin (by Lord Gaylord), produced four stakes winners, including major winner Wicapi (\$671,616, W.L. McKnight H-G2, etc.).

Not For Love was the only Maryland stallion represented at this year's sale, and the Thornmar filly his only yearling offered.

## Welter Weight euthanized

Welter Weight, a longtime star of the Maryland timber racing circuit, was euthanized on July 28 after becoming ill 10 days earlier with complications from an intestinal tumor. He was 21.

Campaigning for the Armata Stable of Perry Bolton and Benjamin H. Griswold IV, Welter Weight won the 1999 edition of the Maryland Hunt Cup, galloping home nine lengths in front of his closest rival. Over the years he also registered four second-place finishes in the timber classic: in 1997, '98, '00 and '01. He captured four runnings of the Grand National (1996, and 1999 to '01) and was twice runner-up in that race (1997 and '98).

Trained throughout his glory years by Tom Voss, Welter Weight retired with a career record of 38 starts and 26 wins or placings, for earnings of \$194,165.

The son of Fit to Fight—Frankie and Johnny, by Spring Double, was bred in Pennsylvania by William Pape and Jonathan Sheppard, and made 20 starts (four on the flat) for his breeders before being purchased by Bolton and Griswold at age 6.

Retired at 13, in 2001, Welter Weight had a second career as a foxhunter, and was a familiar presence in the field with the Elkridge-Harford Hounds. He lived out his life as a beloved resident at Poppet Pitts's Hitchcock Plains Farm in Monkton.

## "New" Sagamore Farm has first graded stakes winner

**H**istoric Sagamore Farm in Glyndon, which is undergoing a revival under its new owner, Under Armour founder Kevin Plank, saw its famous name return to the ranks of graded stakes-winning owners when the 3-year-old filly Shared Account captured the \$150,000 Lake Placid Stakes-G2 at Saratoga on August 21.

The victory in the mile and an eighth turf test followed a close runner-up finish to Maryland-bred Blind Date in

the Virginia Oaks-G3 on July 18 at Colonial Downs.

Trained by Graham Motion, Shared Account, a Kentucky-bred daughter of Pleasantly Perfect—Silk n' Sapphire, by Smart Strike, was purchased by Plank for \$170,000 at the 2007 Keeneland September Yearling sale. A half-sister to graded-placed Mark of Success, she has won four of her eight career starts and earned \$190,560.

**J**ohn Jerome (Jack) Tansey, a well-known Baltimore orthopedic surgeon who had been a longtime member and director of the Howard County Hunt, died on August 24 at the age of 89.

### For Royalty's Mountaineer Juvenile Fillies leads off banner day for Maryland breeders

Cynthia and Charles McGinnes, longtime proprietors of Thornmar Farm in Chestertown, bred two horses who won stakes on August 1. Both are offspring of leading Maryland sire Not For Love.

The richer victory of the two was For Royalty's triumph in the \$85,000 Mountaineer Juvenile Fillies Stakes at Mountaineer Park. Slightly more than an hour after her one-length score for Twin Creeks Racing Stable and trainer Todd Pletcher, the 3-year-old gelding Target Sighted won the Humphrey S. Finney Stakes at Laurel Park for the McGinneses, who own him in partnership with Philip Torsney and Francis Clemens (see stakes writeup on page 3).

Making her second career start, following a maiden-breaking performance at Delaware Park on June 29, For Royalty dueled 1.3-1 favorite Bronx City Girl to the wire in the Mountaineer Juvenile Fillies. The second choice in the field of seven, she completed the six furlongs in 1:11.58 and paid \$6.40 to win. The victory raised her earnings to \$74,225.

For Royalty was sold by the McGinneses for \$250,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Selected Yearling sale. Out of

the stakes-winning mare Taft Lil Queen (by Irish Open), For Royalty is a full sister to multiple stakes-placed The Prince and a half-sister to El Viento, the El Corredor colt who took honors as champion imported 2-year-old colt in Puerto Rico, as well as co-champion Maryland-bred 2-year-old male, in 2005. El Viento was a \$150,000 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Eastern Fall sales yearling.

### Sarah Cataldo stages stakes upset at Delaware Park

Sarah Cataldo carried the banner for long-prominent Maryland owner/breeders Tom and Chris Bowman and Milton Higgins, and Matthew Haney's newly emerging Two Legends Farm, while staging a huge upset in the \$75,000 Tax Free Shopping Distaff Stakes for Delaware Certified fillies and mares at Delaware Park on August 22.

Sent off at third-longest odds in the field of 11, the Richard Small-trained filly closed with a rush to score by three-quarters of a length, rewarding her backers with an \$87 mutuel payoff. Her final six-furlong time over a sloppy (sealed) track was 1:12.86.

From the first crop of Kentucky Derby/Preakness winner Smarty Jones, Sarah Cataldo was bred by the Bowmans, Higgins, Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Sutton and Patricia

Chapman from the accomplished producer Mescalina (by Smarten), whose earlier offspring include Pennsylvania Derby-G2 winner Love of Money, a \$602,705-earning son of Not For Love who is now at stud in Pennsylvania, and multiple stakes winner Astrid (\$242,539).

Sold for \$110,000 at the 2007 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Eastern Fall Yearling sale, Sarah Cataldo has won three of her five career starts, all at 3, for earnings of \$80,400. She is the second 2009 stakes winner for Haney, who also campaigns (in partnership with Richard Golden and David Wade) the 4-year-old Not For Love filly Amie's Legend, winner of the Shine Again Stakes at Pimlico in May. Haney and his wife, Amie, purchased Plane Tree Farm in Chesapeake City several years ago and operate it as Two Legends Farm.

### Sweet Goodbye makes successful return

William R. Harris's homebred filly Sweet Goodbye, last year's Maryland-bred champion 3-year-old filly, returned to the races for the first time since December and proved she was as good as ever, posting every fraction to win the \$75,000 Pink Ribbon Stakes at Charles Town on August 15 by a half length. Her final time for the seven furlongs was 1:25.08. Trained by Christopher Grove, Sweet Goodbye was sent off as favorite, at 1.2-1, with stablemate Two Columbus, in the field of eight.

A daughter of Murmur Farm stallion Louis Quatorze, Sweet Goodbye got her third stakes win in eight lifetime starts and pushed her career earnings to \$221,321. Unraced at 2, the bay filly won five of seven starts at 3 while notching victories in the Maryland Million Oaks (her stakes debut) and the Northern Dancer Stakes, the latter against males. In her final start of 2008, she shipped to Aqueduct and finished off the board in the Ladies Handicap.

The last foal out of Harris's remarkable producer Thirty Eight Steps (by Thirty Eight

Paces), Sweet Goodbye is a half-sister to \$413,746-earner Five Steps, Deer Run (\$408,530, Maryland Million Sprint H, etc.) and Norstep (\$229,845, Politely S, etc.). All nine of Thirty Eight Steps foals to race were winners.

### Toboggan Slide dead heats for victory in Delaware's First State Dash

Toboggan Slide, a Rock Slide colt bred by widely accomplished Maryland horseman Jim Steele, maintained his flawless record while dead heating for victory in the \$75,000 First State Dash for Delaware Certified 2-year-olds on August 22 at Delaware Park.

After dueling maiden Golden Ghost nearly every step of the way in the five-furlong contest, Toboggan Slide reached the wire on even terms with that rival. Maryland-bred Phil's Prospect, who started as 1.6-1 favorite in the field of 10, was five and three-quarters lengths back in third place.

The race was completed in :59.07 over a sloppy (sealed) track.

Owned and trained by Daniel O'Ryan, Toboggan Slide is the fifth foal and first stakes winner from the unraced Norquestor mare My Aunt Dianne, whom Steele also bred. My Aunt Dianne is a half-sister to stakes-placed Twamble (\$368,778).

Toboggan Slide scored by two lengths while making his debut for a \$45,000 maiden claiming tag at Delaware on July 25. In two career starts, he has earned \$51,000.
