B.h., 1997, by Broad Brush —Illeria, by Stop the Music; bred and owned by Robert E. Meyerhoff; trained by Grover G. Delp.

Marylander Robert E. Meyerhoff has won a lot of big races, including the Breeders' Cup Classic-G1, but his home state's premier events, including those holiest of holies, the (Grade 1s) Preakness and

Pimlico Special, had eluded him until last spring.

Then along came Include. Meyerhoff's homebred Include could not have been more impressive in winning the 2001 Pimlico Special over highly regarded foe Albert the Great.

And that was far from the only 2001 highlight for the Grover G. (Bud) Delp-trained

colt, who went undefeated in his first five starts last season, all stakes. Include wove his way through two stakes at Fair Grounds, the Whirlaway Handicap (February 11) and Grade 2 New Orleans Handicap (March 4), then captured Pimlico's Jennings Handicap on Maryland Spring Challenge Day (April 21) as a lead-in to the Special. From there it was on to Suffolk Downs and the Grade 2 Massachusetts Handicap, which he won in a romp over Sir Bear.

Although that would be his final victory of 2001, Include continued to acquit himself well in top company, finishing third in both the July 1 Suburban Handicap-G2 and September 28 Meadowlands Cup-G2 (beaten a half-length by the winner, Gander). His only serious defeat came in the (October 27) Breeders' Cup Classic-G1, in which he was seventh. But he remained unquashed by that experience, and returned on November 23 in Churchill Downs's Clark Handicap-G2, finishing a close second to Ubiquity.

From nine 2001 starts, Include compiled five wins, one second, two thirds and \$1,435,400 in earnings. His career earnings are \$1,532,560.

Include, unanimously voted 2001 Maryland-bred horse

of the year and older male champion, is the fourth homebred Meyerhoff has campaigned to horse of the year honors. He follows in the hoofprints of his sire Broad Brush, Maryland-bred horse of the year in 1986 and '87, Valley Crossing (1993) and Concern (also by Broad Brush) in 1994.

Since 1986, Meyerhoff has raced a grand total of nine Maryland-bred champions, all bred by him.

Meyerhoff bred Include from the graded stakes-winning mare Illeria (Stop the Music—Baldski's Holiday, by Baldski), whom he purchased for \$350,000, in foal to Affirmed, at the 1994 Keeneland November sale. From her first mating with Broad Brush, Illeria produced for Meyerhoff the 1998 Maryland-bred 2-year-old filly champion Magic Broad (\$216,120, Selima S-G3, Maryland Juvenile Filly Championship S, etc.).

Two-year-old male Magic Weisner

Nancy Alberts believed magic was at work when one of her young foals nearly died from a joint infection, then recovered enough for her to envision making him into a race horse. She expressed her gratitude by naming the foal after the veterinarian who cared for him, Dr. Allen Wisner of Glen Rock, Pa.

And last year Magic Weisner (the extra "e" in his name is a clerical error) ran like a horse possessed of something beyond the ordinary.

In his first outing at a distance beyond a mile, in October, "Magic" romped to a frontrunning, eight and a half-

length maiden-breaking victory, and after that there was no looking back. His season culminated in a \$26.20 upset in the \$100,000 Maryland Juvenile Championship Stakes on December 31 at Laurel Park.

Owned and trained—as well as bred—by Alberts, Magic Weisner finished first or second in four of his six juvenile starts, earning \$97,110. His victory in the richest race for Maryland-bred 2-year-olds was the high point in a three decades-long career for Alberts, who had a banner season in 2001 with two homebred stakes winners, the other being Clark's Clone, hero of the Taking Risks Stakes at Timonium.

Alberts was for many years an exercise rider for now-retired trainer J.P. Simpson. She leases a farm in Clarksville,

Md., where she keeps a few broodmares, one of whom is Magic Weisner's dam Jazema.

Alberts became acquainted with Jazema when the mare was in Simpson's barn, and saw in her talent far exceeding her race record—of 30 wins or placings in 68 starts, and earnings of \$89,199. When Jazema's racing career was over, Simpson arranged to sell her to Alberts for a modest price.

Jazema has rewarded Alberts with two stakes performers from her first two

foals, both sired by the young stallion Ameri Valay, who stands at Shamrock Farms in Woodbine, Md. Her first foal was Deliver Hope, who finished third in the 2001 Maryland Million Sweepstakes.

Magic Weisner is the first stakes winner for Ameri Valay, himself a hard-knocking veteran of the Maryland stakes circuit. Ameri Valay won or placed in 24 stakes, earning \$742,779, and was champion Maryland-bred 3-year-old male in 1992.

Two-year-old filly Touch Love

Touch Love's 2-year-old season was shaped like a small, rounded gem, made up of three starts and three wins, each more impressive than the last.

Exceeding expectations at every turn—her lowest post-time odds were 3.9-1—the diminutive bay filly broke her maiden on May 7 at Delaware Park, scoring by a head in a determined effort. She made a big step up to stakes company in her next appearance, the Astoria Stakes at Belmont Park on July 1, and got the job

done in impressive style, battling New York stakes winner Smok'n Frolic through the stretch to triumph by three-quarters of length and reward her backers with an \$18.20 mutuel payoff.

If any doubts remained about Touch Love's quality, they fell by the wayside on opening day of the Saratoga meet (July 25) when she charged through on the rail and led her rivals home by four and three-quarter lengths in the Schuylerville Stakes-G2.

Owners Robert (Willie) White and Lou Rehak, who campaign Touch Love in the name of Skeedattle Stable, were looking forward to running her next in Saratoga's Grade 1 Spinaway on August 31, followed by the Maryland Million Lassie. Unfortunately, those plans went awry when Touch Love was sidelined by sore shins.

But the owners could take consolation in her earnings—a whopping \$148,560 for the fil-

ly who cost them \$17,000 at the 2000 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Eastern Fall Yearling sale.

Trainer Tony Dutrow gets a large share of the credit for the champion, who has been under his tutelage all along.

Touch Love, who earned her championship title by unanimous vote, is the second Maryland-bred 2-year-old filly champion that White and Rehak have campaigned during the past three seasons; Gin Talking, owned by White, Rehak and a third partner, Robert Orndorff, took similar honors in 1999, and in 2000 was named 3-year-old filly champion and horse of the year.

Touch Love was bred by longtime Maryland breeder/owners Charles and Cynthia McGinnes at their Thornmar farm in Chestertown. The McGinneses bought her dam Smartenof (by Smarten) for \$11,500 at the 1994 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic February Mixed sale. ♣

tent 3-year-old colt Saratoga Games.

Saratoga Games, purchased by Dutrow for \$22,000 at the 1999 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Eastern Fall Yearling sale, finished first or second in nine of his ten starts last season, earning \$330,940. He won on the turf and over muddy tracks, at distances from seven furlongs to a mile and an eighth, and was a near-unanimous choice for champion in his division, with seven out of eight voters placing him number one.

Dutrow met Saratoga Games in the winner's circle five times in 2001; those victories, three of which were stakes, were captured by a combined margin of 23½ lengths. Saratoga Games annexed the (May 28) Honor Guard and (June 23) Humphrey S. Finney Stakes at Pimlico during a three-race winning streak, and made his season's grand finale in the Northern Dancer Stakes at Laurel Park on November 24, scoring by eight lengths as overwhelming favorite.

Bolstering Saratoga Games' resume in 2001 were seconds in two rich out-of-state stakes: the \$500,000 West Virginia Derby at Mountaineer Park on

August 11 and the \$314,000 Indiana Derby on October 6 at Hoosier Park.

Saratoga Games campaigns for the highly successful Saratoga Friends Stable, which is composed of longtime Maryland owners Alvin and Marion Akman, Howard and Sondra Bender, and Herb and Arlene Kushner, in addition to Dutrow. Saratoga Friends has had about a dozen starters over the past few years, and half of them have won or placed in stakes, with Saratoga Games being their best to date.

Saratoga Games was bred by Redmond C.S. Finney, retired headmaster of Gilman School, in partnership with Francis X. Poggi. The champion is the third foal and first stakes performer from his dam Boldest Blade (by Highland Blade), who is a winning half-sister to stakes winner Game Quoit and stakes-placed runners Merry Prankster and Cloistered Cutie.

Saratoga Games is the fourth Maryland-bred champion sired by Carnivalay. Others are Carnirainbow, Ameri Valay and Valay Maid, the latter two having taken honors as 3-year-olds. ♣

Three-year-old filly Sparkling Number

Dk.b./b.f., 1998, by Polish Numbers—Sunny Sparkler, by Sunny Clime; bred by David H. Wade; owned by Richard L. Golden; trained by Linda Rice.

There was no clear stand-out among a bevy of talent in last year's Maryland-bred 3-year-old filly division, a fact that was reflected in the balloting. The eight media representatives who made the selections placed nine different fillies among their top choices, and spread their first-place votes among six candidates.

Sparkling Number took the championship title by a one-point margin (over two-time stakes winner Urban Dancer).

A picture of consistency throughout her 3-year-old campaign encompassing 10 starts between March and October, Sparkling Number was never off the board in her five outings in stakes company.

She won two stakes at Monmouth: the Ocean Hotel (June 24) and Candy Eclair (August 11). Her stakes placings consisted of seconds in Delaware Park's Polly Jet Handicap and Meadowlands's Egret Stakes, and a third in the Anderson Fowler Stakes at Monmouth.

From a total of three wins, five seconds and a third, Sparkling Number bankrolled \$118,010 last season.



Sparkling Number has made her career for owner Richard Golden and New York-based trainer Linda Rice, who teamed up to take the 1998 Maryland-bred horse of the year title (plus 3-year-old filly and turf honors) with Grade 1 winner Tenski.

Like Tenski, Sparkling Number is a daughter of Polish Numbers, a top Maryland sire who stands at Northview Stallion Station, of which Golden is managing partner.

While not a homebred, Sparkling Number is in a sense a homegrown commodity, since she was bred by David Wade, longtime manager of Golden's Sycamore Hall Farm in Chesapeake City,

Md. Rice signed the ticket on her for \$57,000 at the 1999 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Eastern Fall Yearling sale.

Sparkling Number is one of three stakes horses Wade has bred from the mare Sunny Sparkler (by Sunny Clime), whom he purchased for \$5,500 at the 1992 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky January sale. The first was Smart Sunny (\$296,856, Mister Diz S, Newark S, etc.), a 1993 Smarten colt bred in partnership with Golden. The mare has also produced Canavakiss, a 1997 daughter of Rakeen who finished third in the 2001 Maryland Million Ladies for Wade and trainer Graham Motion.

Older female Shine Again

If an award were given for the most emotionally-charged major stakes win by a Maryland-bred in 2001, Shine Again would likely win it in a landslide.

The Grade 1 Ballerina Handicap on August 26 at Saratoga gave two of racing's most venerable players—owner/breeder Allaire duPont and Hall of Fame trainer Allen Jerkens—the opportunity to shine again in the national arena.

A widely dismissed longshot in the Ballerina, which featured the likes of Bill Mott-trained multiple stakes winner Dream Supreme (the 1-2 favorite) and 2000 Breeders' Cup Distaff-G1 winner Spain, Shine Again demonstrated how Jerkens long ago earned his nickname "Giant Killer." After moving to the fore at the head of the stretch, Shine Again allowed nothing to come between herself and the wire; she scored by a half-length over hard-charging Country Hideaway, with Dream Supreme finishing third.

And that was far from Shine Again's only moment of glory last season. She won

two other stakes: Belmont Park's Grade 2 First Flight on October 26 (again defeating Dream Supreme) and the Geisha Handicap on Maryland Spring Challenge Day (April 21) at Pimlico. Rounding out her season were placings in three graded stakes: Shine Again finished second in the Noble Damsel Handicap-G3 (September 22 at Belmont), and third in both the Genuine Risk Handicap-G2 (May 12, Belmont) and Molly Pitcher Breeders' Cup Handicap-G2 (June 30, Monmouth).

From 10 starts last season, she had five wins, one second, three thirds and earnings of \$469,750.

Shine Again (by Wild Again) is a fourth-generation homebred for Mrs. duPont, who since the 1950s has operated one of Maryland's premier Thoroughbred establishments, Woodstock Farm in Chesapeake City, Md.

Shine Again's dam Shiner (by Two Punch—Mari Her, by Maribeau) produced two runners who appear on the list of top ten Maryland-bred money winners of 2001. In addition to Shine Again, who ranked second behind Include, Shiner's daughter Shiny Band was eighth. The Dixieland Band filly earned \$189,470 and placed third in the Honey Bee Handicap-G3 last year at age 3.

Turf runner One Eyed Joker

One Eyed Joker competed exclusively on the turf last season, going strong from January through December, and winning at four different race tracks at distances ranging from seven and a half furlongs to a mile and an eighth.

Saving the best for last, he captured two \$100,000 stakes in his final two outings of the season—Meadowlands's Rushing Man Stakes on November 3, and the Pete Axthelm Stakes on December 22 at Calder. His other two victories were Monmouth's Choice Stakes on August 26, and a \$35,000 allowance contest on January 15 at Gulfstream Park.

Two additional stakes placings, namely seconds in the Grade 3 Palm Beach Stakes



(February 19, Gulfstream Park) and Restoration Stakes (August 5, Monmouth), helped to boost his season's earnings to \$240,750 from 13 starts. His career earnings are \$303,940.

One Eyed Joker, who campaigns for owners David Hulkewicz and Mike Rainier and trainer William Perry, was bred by Victor and Valerie Stevens of Chambersburg, Pa.

Although they have been awed, from afar, by the exploits of One Eyed Joker, whom they sold as a weanling for \$47,000 at the 1998 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic December Mixed sale, the Stevenses will always consider his dam Buffels to be the one near and dear to their hearts.

The Stevenses bred Buffels (by Vaal Reef) and raced her

until July of her 3-year-old season, in 1992, when she was claimed from them for \$12,000.

Campaigning for Baird Brittingham and Dan Lufkin's Lakeville Stables, Buffels went on to be a three-time stakes winner and multiple graded stakes-placed earner of \$385,173. But the Stevenses maintained close contact with her throughout her racing career, and when her running days were over they bought her back and added her to their small broodmare band.

A half-sister to stakes-placed Speedquestor (\$239,905), Sylvester Questor (\$160,934) and Kitwe (\$159,751), Buffels produced One Eyed Joker as her second foal. ♣

Dk.b./br.g., 1997, by Poles Apart—Princess Smoggy, by Smoggy (GB); bred by John A. Manfuso; owned by Contrarian Stables; trained by Richard J. Hendriks.

Dead of winter 1998. Horses of all descriptions sold at Fasig-Tipton Midlantic's Winter Mixed Sale. And Malcolm Commer trolled the Timonium stable area for a prospect. A steeplechase prospect.

Commer found one in a lanky, just-turned yearling. The dark bay had a noble head, a decent pedigree (by Commer's standards) and a small price tag. Commer spent \$4,000, and watched his purchase grow up to be Tres Touche—budding steeplechase star and the 2001 Maryland-bred steeplechase champion.

"I was looking at him as a jumping prospect, but he had some potential to run on the flat according to his pedigree," said Commer after Tres Touche broke his hurdle maiden in 2000.

A year later, no one cares about Tres Touche's flat ability.

Trained by Ricky Hendriks for the Contrarian Stables syndicate headed by University of Maryland economist Commer, Tres Touche won three of seven starts in the U.S. and

placed fourth on the National Steeplechase Association earnings list with \$130,509. The 4-year-old capped the season with a third-place effort over hurdles in England. For his two-season career, Tres Touche boasts four wins from 11 starts over fences and more than \$155,000 in earnings.

The horse opened 2001 with a \$50,000 stakes win at Atlanta in April, and then lost by a nose to Eclipse Award finalist Praise the Prince (NZ) in the \$100,000 Hard Scuffle (first leg of the Steeplechase Triple Crown) at Churchill Downs. Tres Touche added a handicap score at Saratoga in August, and a stellar victory in the \$75,000 Foxbrook Novice at Far Hills in October.

The heroics earned Tres Touche an appearance in Fasig-Tipton's advertisements for the 2001 winter mixed sale—a rare feat for a jumper.

"He just seems to get better and better," said Hendriks after the Far Hills win. "He's bigger and stronger physically now."

Tres Touche was bred by the late John A. Manfuso, a longtime Maryland owner/breeder and one-time leader of the local Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association. He was sold as part of the Manfuso estate. ♣

Steeplechaser Tres Touche

Before the last year's racing season began, the decision was made to establish a new category of Maryland-bred champion for 2001—honoring the top sprinter.

As if on cue, Disco Rico sped his way through a succession of five stakes wins, each at a distance of six fur-

longs, and not incidentally became one of the most popular runners to compete in Maryland in recent years.

Best remembered for his performance in winning Pimlico's Maryland Breeders' Cup Handicap-G3 before the Preakness day crowd, Disco Rico geared up with two early-season stakes wins at Laurel Park: the February 3 Hoover Stakes (earning a whopping 115 Beyer speed figure) and March 17 Endless Surprise Stakes (by five and a half



lengths over archrivals In C C's Honor and Dr. Max). He was undefeated in two starts during the Pimlico spring meeting when he also annexed the April 7 Fire Plug Stakes. And his three-race fall campaign concluded with a tour de force in Laurel's Lite the Fuse Stakes, which was to be his final start. He suffered a condylar fracture of a cannon bone in that race and was retired to stand at stud in 2002 at Murmur Farm in Darlington, Md.

Disco Rico has career earnings of \$532,244, including \$349,644 earned last season in nine starts, five wins, a second (in the Paterson Handicap on September 7 at Meadowlands) and a third (in Laurel's seven-furlong General George Handicap-G2, behind Peeping Tom and Delaware Township). Owned by Alfred DiRico of Quincy, Mass., he was a "breakout" horse for his trainer Valora A. (Lori) Testerman, who was honored by the Maryland Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association (MTHA) as

Maryland's outstanding trainer of the year.

Disco Rico (by Citidancer) is the last of numerous stakes winners to represent longtime Maryland breeder C. Oliver Goldsmith, who died in May 1997. His dam Round It Off (by Apalachee) is a granddaughter of Goldsmith's foundation producer, the 1996 Maryland broodmare of the year Turn Capp (by Turn to Reason).

Disco Rico was purchased as a young foal by Ron and Carolyn Green of Green Willow Farms in Westminster, Md. Green Willow sold him for \$45,000 at the 1998 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Eastern Fall Yearling sale; he was subsequently consigned to the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's March 2-year-olds in training auction, where DiRico bought him for \$82,000.

Disco Rico is the only repeat champion among the 2001 honorees; he was champion Maryland-bred 3-year-old male in 2000. ♣

There are lots of ways to win a race, as demonstrated by Bronze Abe's experience in the Jameela Stakes.

The Jameela was supposed to be a cakewalk for Touch Love, the undefeated Maryland-bred 2-year-old filly champion making her first ap-

pearance since her victory last August in Saratoga's Grade 2 Schuylerville Stakes.

Instead it turned into a near-disaster, as Touch Love stumbled and unseated rider Ramon Dominguez right in front of the starting gate, then proceeded to lead the field—reins dangling in front of her—throughout the entire seven furlongs. The crowd at Laurel Park drew a huge collective sigh of relief as Touch Love left the track with no apparent ill effects—beyond the fact that she was eliminated from official competition.

Bronze Abe, dispatched as second favorite among the six starters, meanwhile bested the remaining competition, driving to a two and three-quarter-length victory over extreme longshot Nanden, while Phyxius overcame a rough trip to finish third. Completing the field were No Easy Answer and Cash Machine. The race was timed in a relatively slow 1:27.04.

Bronze Abe has not finished worse than third in any of her 10 career starts, although after crossing the line first in her debut, she was disqualified and placed sixth. In her last four starts, all Maryland-bred or Maryland-sired stakes, she won the Heavenly Cause Stakes on November 17, and finished second in the

October 13 Maryland Million Lassie and third in the December 29 Maryland Juvenile Filly Championship Stakes. She has earned \$149,290.

Bronze Abe campaigns for Samuel Bayard, who purchased her privately last summer from the estate of his late mother, noted Maryland breeder Nancy Bayard.
