Retirement home for horses opens in western Maryland

The Ranger Foundation Inc. is now in operation and taking in horses retiring from long careers of service, such as military horses, police horses, and therapeutic riding horses.

Established by Ann and Howard Corcoran of Greenbriar Farm, on 300 acres in western Maryland, the non-profit retirement home started with its first retiree, Ranger, a military cadet training horse from Valley Forge Military Academy.

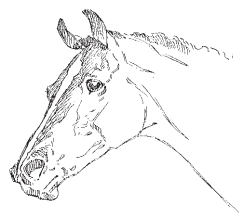
Numbering 10 now, the horses, too old to perform their jobs, are spending the remainder of their days in well-deserved comfort.

The two main goals of the Ranger Foundation are to provide quality care for old or infirm working horses and a place for children and adults to learn horsemanship for free. Volunteers complete 15 lessons dealing with all areas of horse care, and enjoy the light riding that some of the

horses are still able to provide. In addition, the foundation is home to a homeschool horse club for kids and their families.

Winter Leaf staged a \$34.40 upset in the Conniver Stakes on March 9, leading all the way to score by three-quarters of a length over the heavily backed contender Your Out, while 1.1-1 favorite Case of the Blues finished another two lengths back in third.

Next, in order of finish, were Hunka Hunka Lori Z, Lip

Sing's Affair, Benray's Flash, Zuley and Rockin Roy. Final time for the seven furlongs was 1:23.18.

Winter Leaf, owned and bred by Michael and Patricia Sutherland of North Highland Farm in Barnesville, rose to the fore with a victory in the seven-furlong Squan Song Stakes on December 26, but faltered badly and was eased in her next outing after that, the mile and a sixteenth Nellie Morse Stakes won by Case of the Blues on January 20.

Despite a first and a second in two optional claimers (in which she did not run for a tag) in February, Winter Leaf had yet to regain the faith of the bettors until the Conniver.

The Conniver pushed Winter Leaf's earnings, from 15 career starts, to \$165,060.
