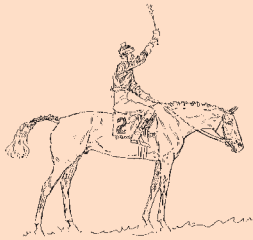

## Meeting the board

This is the first in a series of profiles of current MHBA directors

### Amy Hopkins Daney

Amy Hopkins Daney may be a first-time member of the Maryland Horse Breeders Association's board of directors, having been elected last May, but she is hardly a newcomer to Maryland racing. She was born and raised on her family's Elberton Hill Farm in Darlington, Md., where she has served as farm manager for 15 years.

Daney can't think of a better time to join the MHBA board. "It's a very exciting time in Maryland racing and I'm very excited to be a part of it," she said.

Elberton Hill Farm has campaigned a number of successful homebreds, most notably Aberfoyle, hero of the 1997 Maryland Million Sprint, and Elberton, who won the Maryland Million Turf in 2001 and just missed to La Reine's Terms in this year's renewal of the race. Daney also has a part ownership in both runners.

"I think the Maryland Million program is a wonderful thing," she said, "and it shows that it isn't always the bigger farms that win in Maryland.

"I feel very connected to the smaller guy in the indus-



try and I feel I'm going to represent them well. I think, and I hope, that they're the ones who elected me," Daney said. She intends to represent smaller farms and breeders on the MHBA board by encouraging "all horsemen, no matter what side they're on, breeding or racing, to work together."

One of the specific issues Daney wants to focus on is bringing slot machines to Maryland race tracks. "That's something we really need. States around us have them

and we need them to stay competitive."

Daney has been a member of the MHBA since 1993 and has served on the MHBA Yearling Show Committee. She is also a part-owner of seven broodmares, 13 horses of racing age and 10 young stock.

Daney is married to Michael Daney, an attorney practicing equine law with the firm of Lord & Whip in Baltimore. The Daney family has two daughters: Cassie, 8, and Ellie, 5.

## MARYLAND FUND STAKES RECAPS



### Full Brush

**F**ull Brush, a 7-year-old gelded son of Broad Brush, joined the stakes-winning ranks with a four-length score in Timonium's Taking Risks Stakes. The bettors' third choice in a field of five, Full Brush made his move on the outside going into the final turn of the mile and a sixteenth contest, and drew off under pressure.

Get the Picture, the early leader, held on for second. Following, in order of finish, were P Day, For Love and Honor and The White Sun.

Full Brush campaigns for owner Morris Bailey and trainer

Eddie Gaudet, who claimed him for \$50,000 at Aqueduct on March 1, 2002. Until then he had made his career for his breeders Sondra and Howard Bender, who sent him out to place in four stakes; at 2, Full Brush finished third in both the Rollicking Stakes and Maryland Juvenile Championship Stakes (behind Malaka Head and Carnivorous Habit).

Since being claimed by Bailey, Full Brush has started nine times and registered two wins, two seconds (including Delaware Park's Eight Thirty Stakes on September 24) and two thirds, earning \$75,060. The Taking Risks was the gelding's first stakes effort under the new ownership.

Full Brush comes from a family that has brought the Benders more than a few brushes with success.

They bought his dam Foufa (by Storm Bird) for \$90,000 at the 1989 Keeneland January sale, in foal to Al Mamoon. The colt she was carrying at the time turned out to be Maryland Moon, who won or placed in 13 stakes, including a second-place finish in the 1993 Washington, D.C., International Mile-G1, for earnings of \$420,223.

Foufa has also produced stakes winner Media Access (a 1998 daughter of Devil's Bag who captured last year's Miss Liberty Stakes at Meadowlands), and stakes-placed Certantee (1997, by Known Fact). The mare has a yearling colt by Grand Slam, a weanling filly by Jade Hunter, and is in foal for 2003 to Jade Hunter.

pleting the mile and a sixteenth in 1:45.58 to score by 11 $\frac{1}{2}$  lengths in Timonium's premiere event for distaffers.

Behind her, in order of finish, were Amber Comet, Steppedoutofadream, Anything for You, Hunka Hunka Lori Z and Magic Stream.

It was the third stakes win of the season for Shiny Sheet, a 4-year-old who races as a homebred for Henry and Sheila Rathbun of Middleburg, Va. In July she annexed the Justakiss Stakes at Delaware Park.

Shiny Sheet's achievements continue a long-running success story for the Rathbuns, who have owned five generations of Shiny Sheet's family, beginning with the Double Jay mare Rugosa, a foal of 1967 whom they purchased from Mrs. John W. Hanes.

From each generation of Rugosa's descendants, the Rathbuns have bred at least one stakes winner. Rugosa's daughter Worrisome Thing (a foal of 1974, by Cyane) won the 1977 Anne Arundel Handicap and later produced three stakes horses, including General Strike (\$140,402, J. Rine Strohecker Memorial S, etc.).

Worrisome Thing's daughter Puzzlement (1981, by Tentam) won or placed in eight of 31 starts, earning \$22,557. She produced as her first foal, in 1987, graded stakes winner Miss Otis (\$326,615, Noble Damsel S-G3, 3rd Chrysanthemum H twice, etc.).

Miss Otis (by One for All) is the dam of Shiny Sheet.

**T**imonium's Alma North Stakes was a romp for Shiny Sheet, the talented Press Card filly who rose to prominence with a victory in the Geisha Handicap on Maryland Spring Challenge Day last April.

Facing five rivals, including the 2001 Alma North heroine Steppedoutofadream, Shiny Sheet—the 1.7-1 favorite—rated just off the early pace set by Amber Comet and Steppedoutofadream, moved to command with slightly more than a quarter-mile to go, and was driven to the wire, com-
